*Miserere mei, Deus*

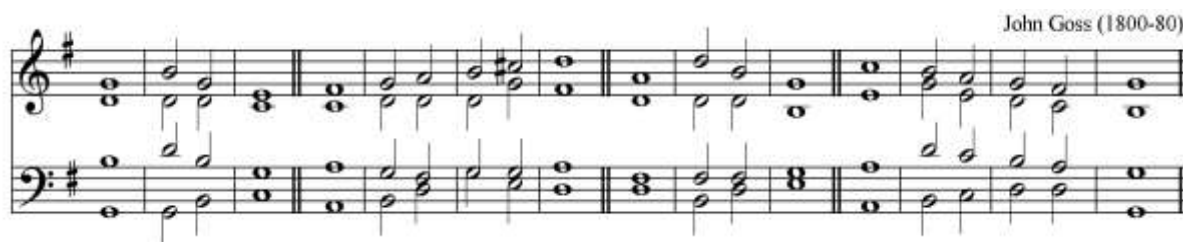


One of the earliest examples of a double chant that has survived in general use : date c.1715.
